

CCPM Representation at COP 25, Madrid, Spain

The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) has over the years organised yearly conferences where countries that are parties to the UNFCCC discuss Climate Change and its management from a global perspective considering that climate change is a global problem. The 25th meeting of the Conference of Parties (COP25) was convened in Madrid, Spain from 1st to 13th December, 2019. The Madrid Climate Change Conference was aimed to continue with the development of the implementation mechanisms of the Paris Agreement, among other issues.

CISONECC represented *Climate Challenge Programme Malawi* advocacy partners in participating at the Climate Change Conference. The purpose of CCPM representation was to bring the voices and concerns of the CCPM Programme Participants on climate change and climate justice to an international stage through engagements in various forums that were created during the conference: to build knowledge and global networks; and to further the CCPM advocacy objectives.

The representatives collaborated with Malawi Government officials during the meeting to lobby the UNFCCC secretariat for financial and technical support on the development and implementation of the NAP. The team also managed to engage in formal discussions and raise the profile and visibility of CCPM at key events highlighted in the main report. Following the meeting, CISONECC reviewed the outcomes of COP25 negotiations in line with the COP25 expectations from the CCPM Programme Participants, and collaborated with government of Malawi to disseminate the outcomes.
