

Stakeholder Dialogue on Energy Policies and Priorities in Malawi

CISONECC with support from African Coalition for Sustainable Energy and Access; Malawi Platform (ACSEA) conducted a national level stakeholder dialogue on the state of play on government policies, strategies and plans in November, 2019 in Mponela, Dowa. The aim of the meeting was to discuss a number of policies including the National Energy Policy and the Renewable Energy Strategy which were meant to help in influencing the African Development Bank (AfDB) and Sub-Saharan countries to increase their investments in decentralized energy systems by the end of year 2020.

The meeting served as a platform where different players in the energy sector including ACSEA Malawi Platform shared updates on work undertaken at national, district and community level to contribute to shaping an inclusive, sustainable and clean energy sector in Malawi. The meeting also updated stakeholders on the partnership between CISONECC and Pan-African Climate Justice Alliance (PACJA) in line with renewable energy advocacy work.

The outcome of the meeting was enhanced awareness of all stakeholders on the development of the Climate Change Fund and the current status establishment of the National Climate Change Management fund; and increased stakeholder knowledge and understanding on the national energy policies, legal frameworks, plans and existing efforts undertaken by various players on advancing a sustainable and decentralized energy sector at all levels.
